ADMINISTRATION

Principal, the academic and administrative head of the institution, facilitates overall development of the students and the faculty. The Principal of the College is assisted in discharging the duties by the Vice Principal and the Staff Council having due representation of the Heads of the Departments. All the major decisions and policy changes are implemented in consultation with the staff council. The staff coordinators of various committees and Clubs convene meeting regularly to inform and disseminate various academic and administrative quality assurance schemes launched by our regulatory bodies.

The Parents Teacher's Association (PTA) is very proactive towards various issues related to the discipline and the day to day administration of the college. The College Development Council with due representation of the elected members/staff and bureaucrats devise plans
for the effective utilization of the CDC funds. The examinations of the
college and by the University are conducted as per the strict schedules of
University. The semester examinations are conducted by a system headed
by Chief Superintendent of examination and assistant superintendents.
This system receives the question papers from the university and responsible for safe custody and administration of the entire examination. The

on the college notice board and eventually uploaded to the University
website ensuring complete transparency. The college has a separate



ACADEMICS

First Degree Programmes Under the Choice Based Credit and Semester System (CBCSS)

(Extract from the University of Kerala Regulations for the First Degree Programmes under the / Choice Based Credit and Semester system (CBCSS) in Affiliated Colleges 2009 as per UO Ac. All / 1/ UGSem / 2009 dated 6-07-09).

The first degree programme shall include 1) Language Courses, 2) Foundation Courses, 3) Core Courses in the major subjects related to the degree programme 4) Complementary Courses on allied subjects 5) Open / Elective Courses and 6) Dissertation. The minimum number of Courses required for completion of a Degree Programme may vary from 30-38 depending on the credit assigned to different Courses. The students may choose the major Subject of study at the beginning of the programme and shall join a department.

Language Courses and Foundation Courses shall be offered in the Ist, 2nd, 3rd and 4th semesters. Core Courses may be offered from the Ist semester onwards along with the Complementary courses and shall include a compulsary project/Dissertation to be undertaken during the 5th / 6th semesters. Open/Elective Courses may be offered in any subject and the student will have the option to do courses offered in any subject and the student will have the option to do courses offered by other departments and specialized, advanced/applied courses offered by the same department.

The Core Courses prescribed by the University for the First Degree programmes shall be offered by the parent Department. More than one combination of complementary Courses in allied subjects may be offered depending on the availability of teachers and infrastructure facilities (e.g. Chemistry with Mathmetics and Physics or Chemistry with mathematics and computer Science or Chemistry with Mathematics and Zoology.

The student is free to take any combination of complementary Courses offered by the institution and is also free to select any elective courses offered by the departments. The students shall do open/Elective



Courses totalling to a minimum of 4 credits but not more than 200 credits. However, the students may ascertain from the Faculty advisor the suitability and usefulness of such courses to increase the academic potential and opportunity / eligibility for higher studies.

The Student secures the credits assigned to a course on successful completion of the course. The students shall be required to earn a minimum of 120 credits including credits of language courses, foundation courses, core courses, complementary courses, dissertation and open/elective courses as indicated below within a minimum period of 6 semesters for the award of the Degree excluding credit acquired for social service / extension activity. The minimum required credits for the different courses for the award of the Degree are given below.

Attendance

Attendance shall be taken at the beginning of each period. A student who is not in class when attendance is taken shall be marked absent. A student who is not present in the class for one period will be marked absent in the attendance register for half a day and a student who is not present in the class for more than one period will be marked absent for the whole day. The attendance of each student shall be totalled at the end of each month and tabulated in the register, after which no alteration shall be made. The minimum number of hours of lectures.



tutorials, seminars or practicals which a student shall be required to attend for eligibility to appear at the End Semester Examination shall not be less than 75% of the total number of hours of lectures, tutorial sessions, laboratory sessions and or any prescribed requirements for each course. Percentage of attendance shall be calculated course-wise. To determine the eligibility for registration for the end Semester Examination, the average of the course-wise percentage of attendance shall be considered.

Condonation of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester, subject to maximum of two times during the whole period of a Degree Programme may be granted by the University. A student whose attendance falls below the minimum should apply for exemption through the Principal to the University. Application for exemption should be accompanied by a challan receipt for the prescribed fee and an explanatory statement for each day of absence. A medical certificate should also be submitted in the case of absence exceeding five consecutive working days on account of ill health. Benefits of attendance may be granted to students who attend University Union activities, meetings of University bodies and participation in extra curricular activities by treating as present, for the days of their absence for the above purpose on production of participation / attendance certificate in such activities issued by the university Authorities /Principal. subject to a maximum of 10 days in a semester. Those who secure a minimum of 75% attendance in the aggregate for all the courses of a semester taken together alone will be allowed to register for the End Semester Examination of each semester.

Evaluation and grading

Evaluation of each Course shall be done in percentage score and shall involve continuous evaluation (CE) with a weightage of 20% and End Semester Evaluation (ESE) with a weightage of 80%

Assignments or Seminar

For each shall be required to do assignments or one seminar for each Course. Valued assignments shall be returned to the students. The seminars shall be organized by the teacher / teachers in charge or CE and the same shall be assessed by a group of teachers including the teacher / teachers in charge of that course.

Tests

For each Course there shall be class tests during a semester, grades for the test component in CE shall be awarded on the basis of the average of grades secured for the class tests. Valued answer scripts shall be made available to the students for perusal.

Announcement of results of CE.

The result of the CE shall be displayed within 5 working days from the last day of a semester. Complaints regarding the award of grades of CE if any, have to be submitted to the Head of the department within 3 working days from the display of results of CE. These complaints shall be examined by the Department committee and the decision arrived at shall be communicated to the student.

The statement of grades of the CE of all student shall be approved by the Department Committee, countersigned by the principal and forwarded to the controller of Examinations.

End Semester Evaluation (ESE)

End Semester Examination of all the courses in all semesters shall be conducted by the University. The results of the ESE shall be arranged to be published according to the examination calendar prescribed by the university level monitoring committee.



Project Dissertation work

For each First Degree Programme there shall be a project / Dissertation work

The Project / Dissertation work can be done either individually or by a group not exceeding 15 students. However, viva-voce based on the project / Dissertation work shall be conducted individually. The topics shall either be allotted by the supervising teacher or be selected by the students in consultation with the supervising teacher.

The report of the Project / Dissertation shall be submitted to the department in duplicate before the completion of the sixth semester. There shall be no continuous assessment for Dissertation / Project work.

A Board of two examiners appointed by the University shall evaluate the report of the project / Dissertation work.

Social Service / Extension Activity

It is mandatory for a student to participate in any of the following Social Service /Extension Activities for not less than forty hours, during the 3rd and 4th Semesters for successfull completion of the programme.

There shall be a General Coordinator to be nominated by the College Council, for the conduct of all these activities.

A statement testifying the participation of the students shall be forwarded to the University along with the statement of CE results for the 4th Semester.

Those who have not secured the minimum number of hours of Social Service / Extension Activity during the 3rd and 4th Semester shall secure the minimum required attendance by attending such programmes during the subsequent 5th and 6th Semesters.

Promotion to Higher Semesters

Students who complete the semester by securing the minimum required attendance as specified above, and registered for the end semesters examination conducted by the University of each semester shall be promoted to the next higher semesters.

Repetition of Semester courses

Students who fail to secure the minimum required aggregate attendence during a semester shall be given one or more chance to repeat the semester along with the subsequent batch of students after obtaining re-admission, subject to the provision that no student shall be allowed to complete the programme by attending more than 12 continuous semesters.

Re-appearance of failed students

Students who fail shall have to reappear for the ESE of the same along with the next regular batch of students, failed candidates will have to appear for the examination in the Course concerned. They shall not be allowed to repeat the semester but the marks secured by them for the CE part shall be carried over to the marks of ESE so reappeared.

Grade Card and Award of Degree

The University shall issue to the students a Grade Card on completion of each semester indicating the details of Courses, credit points and Grades. The final grade card issued at the end of the final semester on completion of the programme shall contain the details of all courses taken during the entire programme including additional courses taken over and the prescribed minimum credits for obtaining the degree. No student shall be eligible for the degree unless he/she has duration and secured at least 120 credits (excluding credits for social service / extension). The Degree to be awarded shall be called Bachelor's Degree in the respective discipline.

GENERAL LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

- ♦ All students of the college are members of the Library and Reading room
- ♦ The library will remain open on all working days from 9.00 am. to 4.30 pm.
- ♦ Silence shall be strictly observed in the Library, Reading Room and its premises.
- ♦ Books will be issued only on production of identity cards.
- ♦ Books in the reference section will not be lent out. They may be referred inside the library hall.
- ♦ A student is permitted to borrow only one book at a time.
- ♦ Students are not allowed to keep the borrowed book for more than ten days
- ♦ Failure to return a book on the due date entails a fine of 1 rupee per day.
- ♦ Books taken for the vacation shall be returned within the first three working days, after reopening.
- ♦ A student against whom any charge is outstanding will not be allowed to borrow books from any library.
- ♦ Marking, underlining, tearing of pages or damaging of any book or manuscript will invite severe punishment.
- ♦ While borrowing book students shall bring to the notice of the librarian damages if any in the book, otherwise they will be held responsible for such damages.
- ♦ Compensation for books lost or in any way damaged must be paid according to the librarian 's estimate of their value.
- No newspaper or periodical should be taken out of the reading room.

The general library is well equipped with good titles. Easy accessibility, sufficient seating capacity, ample number of books pertaining to various disciplines of study are the hallmark characteristics of the library. The books are cataloged and the automation process has been started All



the students who are admitted in an academic year are members of the library. Apart from printed books, reference texts, magazines, journals, newspapers are available in the library. The e-library (Inflibnet) concept has enabled the students to manipulate and extract latest and modern information and data utilizing e-resources. The students are provided a learning atmosphere, and are permitted to lend book regulated by the norms of the college library. However, reference texts are meant to be read and referred within the library. Yearly addition of new books is an added advantage to maintain and remain in the foray to assimilate knowledge. The up gradation of library with latest editions of books and reference texts supplements the entire leaming process.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

With a view to comprehensively improving the all round performance of the student and providing greater opportunities for the personal rapport between the teacher and the taught, the tutorial system has been introduced. Students of each class will be under the charge of a teacher of the respective dcpt. designated as "Group Tutor"

Each Group Tutor will regularly monitor the progress and conduct of the students of his group and generally advise them on avenues of academic improvement.

Leave of absence of students will be granted only if the applications are recommended and forwarded by the group tutor. No conduct certificate will ordinarily be issued to a student except on the recommendation of the Group Tutor.



RESIDENCE OF STUDENTS

All Students who do not reside with their parents or guardians shall reside in lodging approved by the Principal. Students shall soon after admission, forward to the college office full information regarding their residence. Change in residence should be reported immediately to the Principal.

EXCURSION, PICNICS AND STUDY TOUR

- 1. Students are not permitted to organize or conduct excursions or picnics without the knowledge and consent of the class teacher concerned.
- 2. Study tours will be organized by the respective Departments.
- 3. Only final year students (III DC, Final PG.) will be permitted to go on excursions and tours.
- 4. Written consent in the prescribed form should be obtained from the guardians by all students going on excursion.
- 5. A detailed programme of travel, stay, places of visit, names of participants.etc; should be submitted to the principal before proceeding on a tour or excursion
- 6. No student from one class will be permitted to join another class going on, excursion.
- 7. There should be at least two teachers (one male and one female) to accompany each team.

PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION



ADMISSION PROCEDURE.

ADMISSION AND RELATED MATTERS

1 ADMISSION RULES:

Refer concerned University Rules

2. TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

No Transfer Certificate will be issued to those from whom there are any dues to the college. No. fee will be levied from those who apply for TC within one year after leaving the college. Late fee of Rs. 50/- will be levied from those who apply for TC after the lapse of one year from the date of leaving the college. Rs.100/- will be levied from those who apply for duplicate copy of the TC with the recommendation of the First Class Magistrate (in stamp paper worth Rs 100/-) No student who has previously studied in any recognized school or college shall be admitted to the college unless he presents the Transfer Certificate.

.3. COURSE AND CONDUCT CERTIFICATE

Conduct Certificate is a document which the student has to earn. It will not be issued as a matter of right. Course and Conduct Certificate from the last Institution is compulsory for admission to any course.

4. ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Attendance shall be marked at the beginning of each class, whether lecture, practical, composition or tutorial by the member of the staff in charge of the class. For the purpose of attendance, all working days shall be counted as whole day irrespective of the number of working hours. The days that will be taken into account are those marked as working days in the College Calendar or notified by the Principal (special class will not count for extra attendance) A working day is divided into five periods each of one hour duration in general. The attendance for physical training shall be totalled separately. In the degree classes, the attendance in any part shall be totalled separately.



5. ATTENDANCE SHORTAGE AND CONDONATION NB:- Students are informed th they should get 75% of attendance in each semester, and should they fall short, the deficiency will be condoned only where the Syndicate is satisfied that the absence was for reasons beyond the control of the student. For other conditions, refer concerned university rules. 94 No student shall absent himself/herself from a class without leave. Absence without leave of part of a session shall be considered as absence for half a day. Students absenting themselves without leave for more than 10 working days will have their names removed from the rolls. They may be readmitted at the discretion of the Principal, in which case they will have to pay the re-admission fee of Rs. 50 and all college fees due before they are re-admitted. A student coming to the class late without leave shall lose half a day's attendance, unless otherwise recommended by the member of the staff in charge of that class. Application for leave should be made in the form to the Principal through the recommending authority (Tutor) by the student himself before hand, except in unavoidable and unforeseen circumstances when the application should be made on the very day of his return to the college. The Attendance and Progress Certificate for each semester shall not be granted unless the student has got three-fourth of the attendance prescribed by the college in the course for instruction and for physical training; to the satisfaction of the authorities and his/her progress and conduct have been satisfactory. .6. RE-ADMISSION TO COURSES FOR STUDENTS DISCON-TINUED STUDIES Students who discontinue their studies can rejoin the same course after prior sanction from the concerned University. After re-admission the examination can be written in continuation to the previous ones provided the scheme and the syllabus remain the same. Otherwise, all the papers will have to be attempted again. Readmission fee of Rs.50/- and all other fees except caution deposit to be remitted. 7. RULES FOR COLLEGE TRANSFER: Refer respective University Orders



- NORMS PROPOSED FOR ADMISSION TO SENIOR CLASSES OF VARIOUS COURSES: Refer University orders
- 9. MIGRATION CERTIFICATE The students of other Universities and Boards of Secondary/ Higher Secondary Education (Except State Boards like VHSC, Plus Two) who join any University should produce Migration Certificate issued by the concerned Universities and Boards. University has exempted the students of Higher Secondary course (+2), Vocation Higher Secondary Education Course and Technical Higher Secondary Education Course of Govt. of Kerala from producing Migration Certificate and getting individual recognition order. 95
- 10. REGISTRATION AS MATRICULATE OF THE UNVIERSITY The students of other Universities and Boards who join any University should submit the application in the prescribed form with Migration Certificate, General form, Matriculation fee receipt and chalan receipt for prescribed fee before the University through the Principal. Application for Matriculation should reach the University Office as instructed by concerned University.
- ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE Applicants from outside the state have to get Eligibility Certificate from the University to join any course.
- 12. UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION EXTENTION OF TIME FOR PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED. Physically Handicapped candidates can avail themselves of time extension for various University Examinations. Apply to the Controller of Examinations in a plain paper along with medical certificates and a photo showing disability duly attested by the Medical Officer well in time before the commencement of examination. In the case of PH students' amanusy (scribe) /interpreter can be appointed by the Principal (See University Rules).
